
**Public Notice**

In view of the diversification of trade in fish and fishery products globally and the importance of sanitary requirements of the importing country to be met by the exporting country, the Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries (DADF) has prepared draft sanitary requirements for import of seven categories of fish and fishery products into India.

Comments/views are invited from stakeholders on the draft sanitary requirements for import of the following categories of fish and fishery products into India with regard to the applicability to prospective import of the related products from various exporting countries:

- Prawn feed / Shrimp feed / Fish feed
- Larval Feed
- Fish meal/Shrimp meal/Krill meal
- Squid meal/ Scallop meal/ Mussel meal
- Fish powder
- Squid powder/Scallop powder/ Mussel powder/Squid Liver powder

## 1. Sanitary Requirements for import of Artemia Cysts and flakes into Republic of India

1. A certificate from the Competent Authority of the exporting country to the effect that:
  - i. The product has been tested negative for all existing OIE listed diseases of crustaceans [Except White spot disease and Infection with yellow head virus (genotype 4)]
  - ii. The product has been processed following control of pathogenic agents in aquatic animal feed as specified in Chapter 4.8 of OIE-Aquatic Animal Health Code.
  
2. Producer/Exporter shall ensure that the product has proper labelling with details such as content, batch/ lot, code, source (cultured or wild), country of origin, date of production, shelf life etc. for establishing traceability. The label shall also conform to the Article 4.8.6.3 of OIE-Aquatic Animal Health Code.

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
